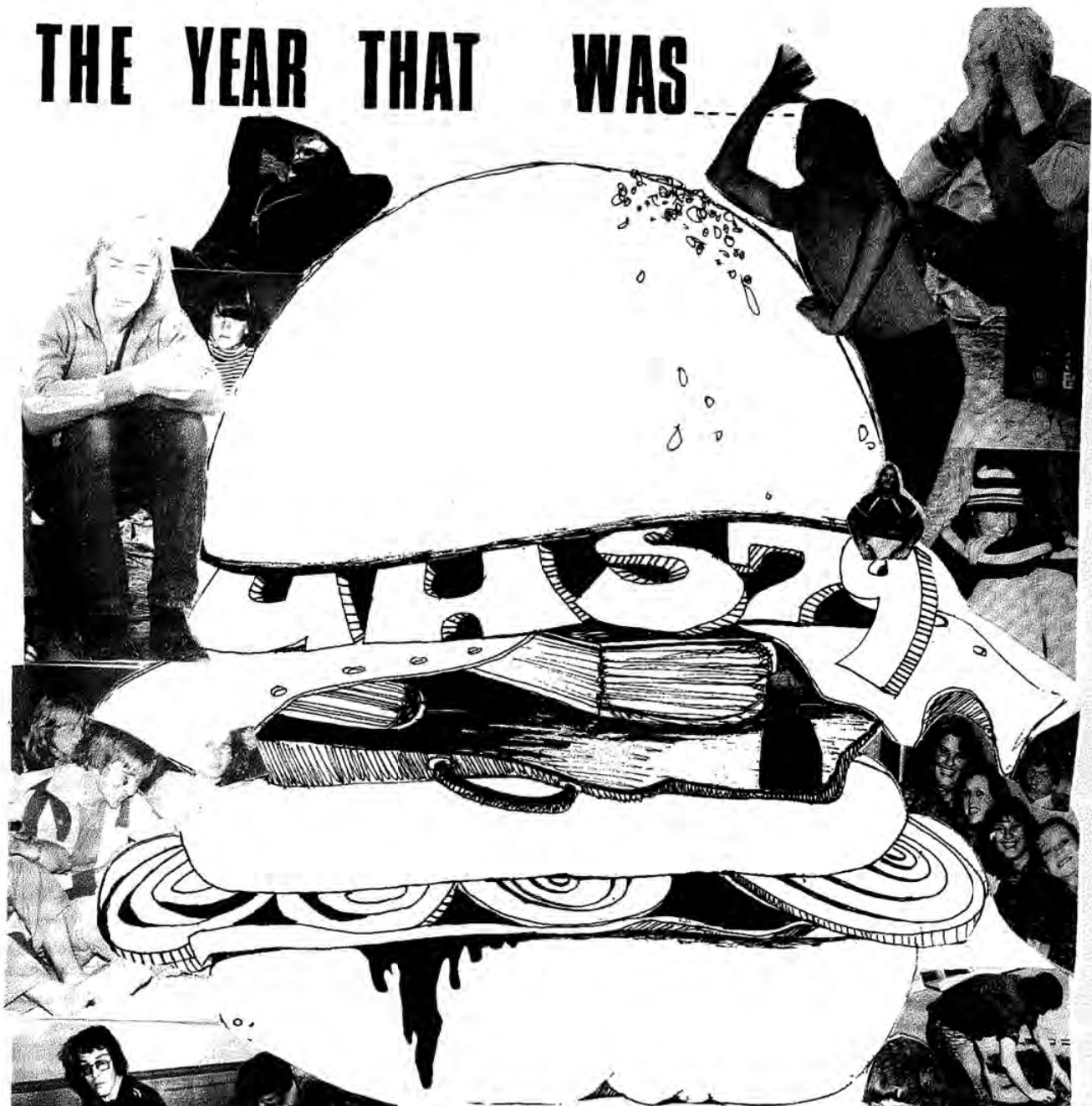

Mrs Ward came to this school with a wealth of experience as a Principal. She was well known for her work in the field of Pastoral Care, social development and communications. At Underdale she endorsed and encouraged the vertical grouping from year 8 to 12, of students into Home Groups and the re-introduction of a modified house system.

Mrs Ward appreciated the setting of the main building within the surrounding areas of lawn and sporting facilities. One of her major concerns has been the beautification of the grounds by the planting of trees, the addition of garden areas and the erection of pergolas. In this she has had the support of both the Council and Canteen Committees.

Her interest in a general up-grading is evidenced also in the furnishing of the administrative and parent-interview rooms and the redeployment and addition of pictures throughout the school.

Mrs Ward is, herself, interested in a wide range of cultural activities, and encouraged the school as a whole and individual groups to participate in such functions. In this Year Of The Child, the response of the staff and students has made it possible to sponsor four children from developing countries for three years and to assist also the Child/Parent project in our own district at Cowandilla.

Mrs Ward and members of the Council have been disappointed with the lack of financial support for projects which should normally have been the responsibility of the Education Department. She came to Underdale at a time when investigation had shown that it was no longer practical

to continue the planning for a school hall. Much of the money in hand had been raised by parents whose children were still enrolled at the school. Her view that it was wise to allocate some of the money accumulated to projects which would give immediate benefit to those students as well as to future students, received general support. As a consequence the Council has provided money and the staff and students have benefited by the extension of the Library including carpeting and furnishing, provision of storage space, air-conditioning, the supply of equipment for the new science laboratory and a number of improvements and additions throughout the school.

All these projects are tangible and lasting evidence of her interest in the up-grading of facilities and the general school environment. If there is one regret she might have it is that, because approval for subsidy has not been given, the building of a recreational centre has been delayed.

Mrs Ward leaves us at the end of this year and we wish her a long and happy retirement filled, as it will be, with her many and varied interests, interspersed of course, with trips to Bali and innumerable cups of tea and telephone conversations.

INTERNATIONAL YEAR OF THE CHILD

FUND RAISING ACTIVITIES

We decided to try to support a very poor child from a Third World Country overseas through "Plan and to "adopt" a school in our area which had some need we could supply. I chose Cowandilla Child Parent centre because I know the director and she was setting up a Toy Library with a small grant (from the Schools Commission, I think).

The total cost for our International Year of the Child Appeal was to be about \$1 000 or \$1.50 per head of school population.

Through Home Group barbecues and stalls etc., the Spellathon, Chessathon, the Mr Sutton-organized massive Walkathon and the socials, the school has raised more than three times that amount.

We have taken lovely toys over to Cowandilla four times so far - toys donated or made in our Technical Studies and Dressmaking and also batik cushions made in Art.

We have paid the first year's money to support four Third World children and have the money for the four to be kept for three years - a splendid effort.

My thanks and congratulations to the whole staff and all the students.

MUSIC NOTES

Music students in Years 9,10 and 11 have been on several excursions this year, seeing a variety of shows in the performing arts sectors of dance, theatre and instrumental concerts.

There has been an increasing interest in dance and movement to music in many classes, aided a little I'm sure, by some of the excellent dance productions which we have seen. The performances of "Wildstars" and "Black Angels" by the Australian Dance Theatre showed students what a talented group of dancers we have in Adelaide. Seeing a rehearsal of the New South Wales Ballet Company proved to be an interesting insight for many of us into the rigorous training required of a dancer.

The year 11 class were treated to an excellent piece of Music Theatre when we saw "Lola Blau", a ninety minute one-woman show by Robyn Archer. This was not only highly entertaining but also very educational, both musically and historically.

Early in the year, students from years 9 to 12 attended a concert given by the Australian Youth Orchestra - a large group of young people with loads of talent. Instrumental groups from the Adelaide College of the Arts and Education have also come to the school to perform for several classes.

We now have 35 students learning a musical instrument at school from Music Branch teachers who come into the school once a week. Most of these students played in the school orchestra. After a delayed start, orchestral rehearsals are now progressing smoothly and we are gradually increasing our repertoire. Smaller ensembles practise together in class groups, some of whom have performed for elderly citizens at the Serene Private Hospital.

At the beginning of third term our matric students were joined by other matric performers from Findon, Kidman Park and Clare High Schools for a performance of their exam programs and a preliminary "ridding of butterflies". It was decided to hold this get-together at Underdale for the benefit of the pianists. It seems that we are the only school in this area with a grand piano!

The music department has received a face-lift this year. It has been newly carpeted throughout and furnished with practical tables and chairs which are easily moved for rehearsals, dancing and movement work.

In second term the School Council kindly donated \$710 for a new Yamaha drumkit. Two new oboes will also be brought by a combined offer from the Parents and Friends Association and the Canteen Ladies.

GREEN HOUSE

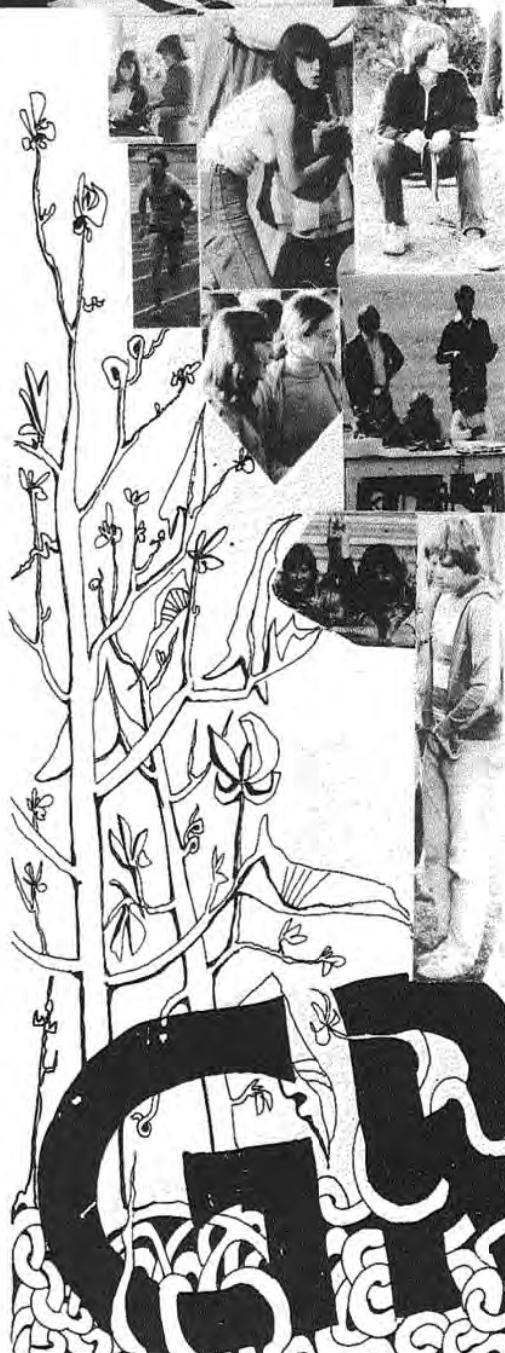

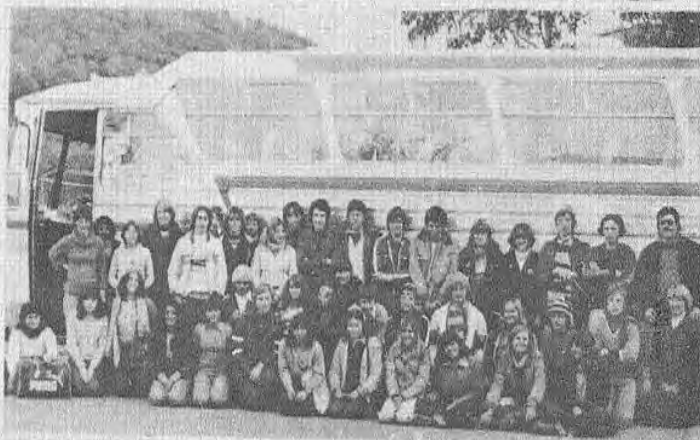

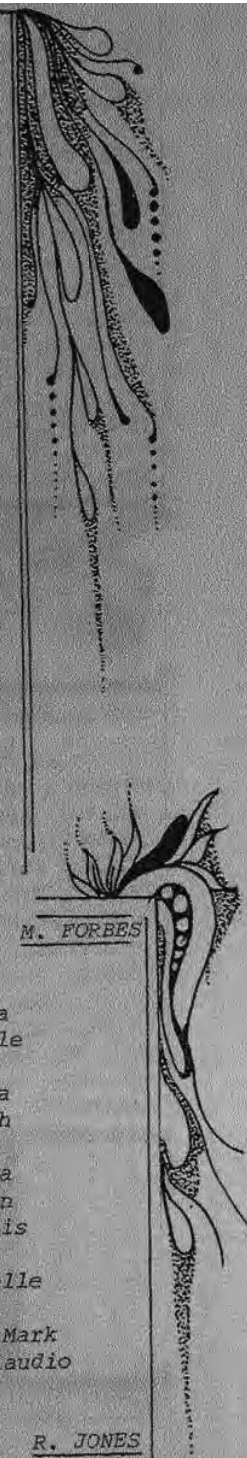

PERFORMING WITH TRIBAL PEOPLE

An exciting event for some year 9, 10 and 11 students in third term, was participating in the United Nations ethnic performances held in Adelaide. The group of twenty students were taught by and performed with tribal Aboriginal elders and women from Indulkana Reserve in the far north-west of South Australia. All who participated in these performances found them to be both enjoyable and educational. Some of the comments captured from those involved, aptly describe our unique experience.

"The girls dressed in boob tubes and P.E. skirts so that the women could paint us. They daubed the bright colours on our legs, arms, chests and noses in patterns of squares, stripes and dots".

"One of the best things was being painted up. It's not something you do everyday!"

"We were all worrying about our tops falling down when we danced, when we noticed the Aboriginal ladies were going to dance topless! This surprised us very much and consequently our wariness about our own tops lessened".

"Finally the moment came when we had to dance before the audience. Going through the door was the worst. I could almost feel my class (B1) staring at me. It was a bit embarrassing at first".

"When we first started dancing I was scared because of all the people watching us, but I soon became so involved with the Aboriginals and with what we were doing that I forgot about the audience".

"The Aborigines gave me the impression that they really loved and cared about what they were doing and this made me feel privileged that they were teaching us a little of their culture. They seemed to really appreciate us being involved".

"Relating to these people had its limitations because of the language barrier but I found that we could often communicate without the use of speech. That was a new experience for me".

"I was amazed at the agility of the Aboriginal people when they sat in the most awkward positions for long periods of time when singing - positions which would make me ache for days!"

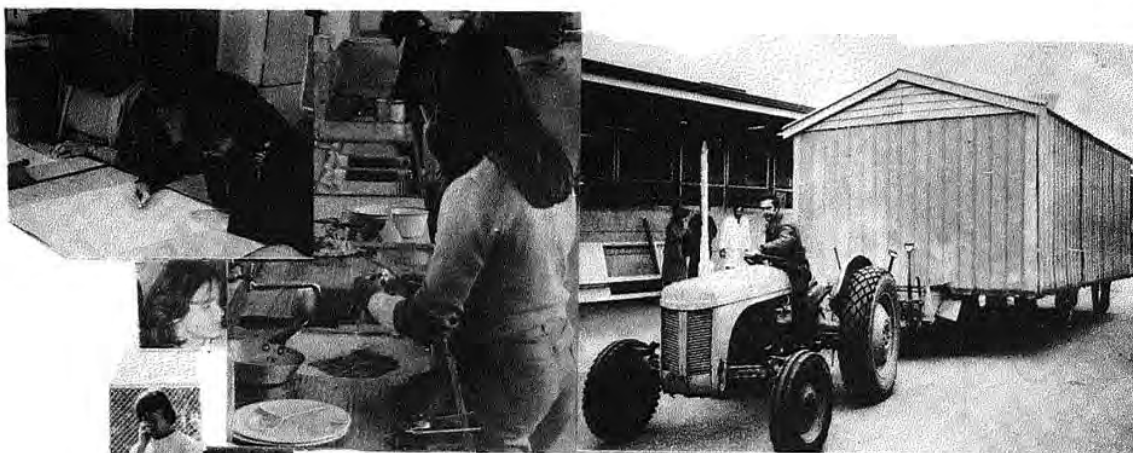

JOB EXPERIENCE

UNDERDALE HIGH SCHOOL

The last week of second term, once again found 19 year 11 commercial girls on "Job Experience".

Job Experience for Underdale High School Students involves a few preliminary 'functions' all designed to train the students for what they will meet in the next few months as they begin to apply for and hopefully start, jobs. The students spend a week at various firms, putting into practise the theory learnt at school.

This year it was August 20th - 24th.

Students performed many duties. They were involved in filing, reception work, typing letters, mailing letters, copy typing, the use of the switchboard, running errands and any other jobs that the firm thought applicable.

The week before, all the girls and the commercial teachers gave a luncheon to meet their temporary "employers". The luncheon was well attended by representatives from the firms, which gave the girls a chance to "get to know them" and enable students to find out any necessary details connected with the coming week.

Ms. Rita Freeman of Linkstaff, addressed the group, on the subject of "Requirements for Job Interviews".

As well as the luncheon, the girls were interviewed by Mr Harold Anderson, a local businessman, after completing a full written application for a fictitious job, complete with references etc.

All in all, the Job Experience scheme was beneficial to those who participated, as it gave them a practical impression of what to expect in the near future.

Comments taken from the girls themselves and the 'employers', show this, and it is hoped that this scheme will be able to continue, despite economic difficulties.

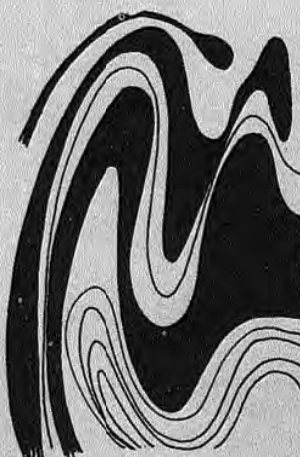

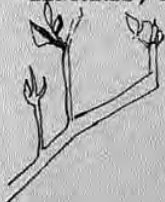

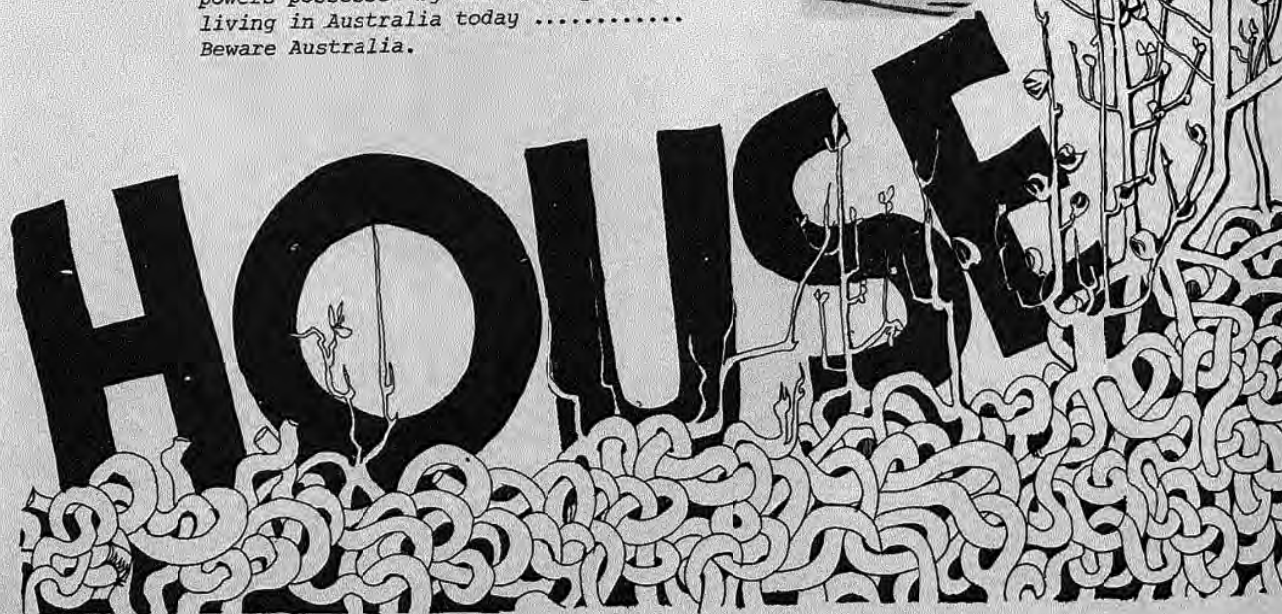
In the first year of the House Colour competition, the Green House Soccer Team showed its true ability in winning the A grade soccer competition.

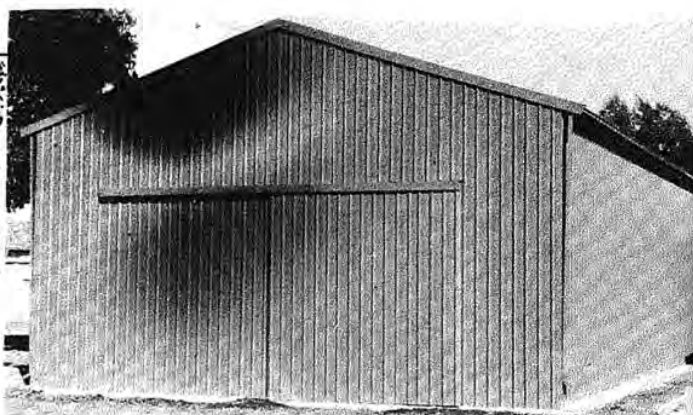
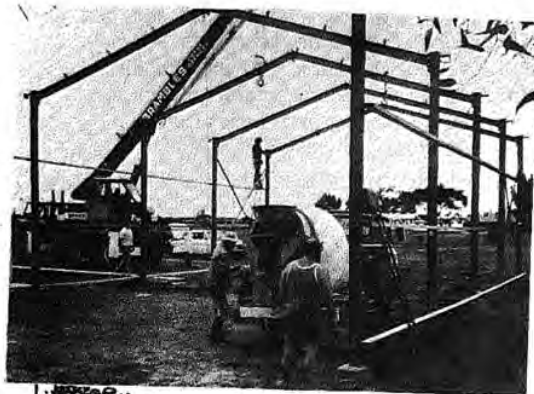

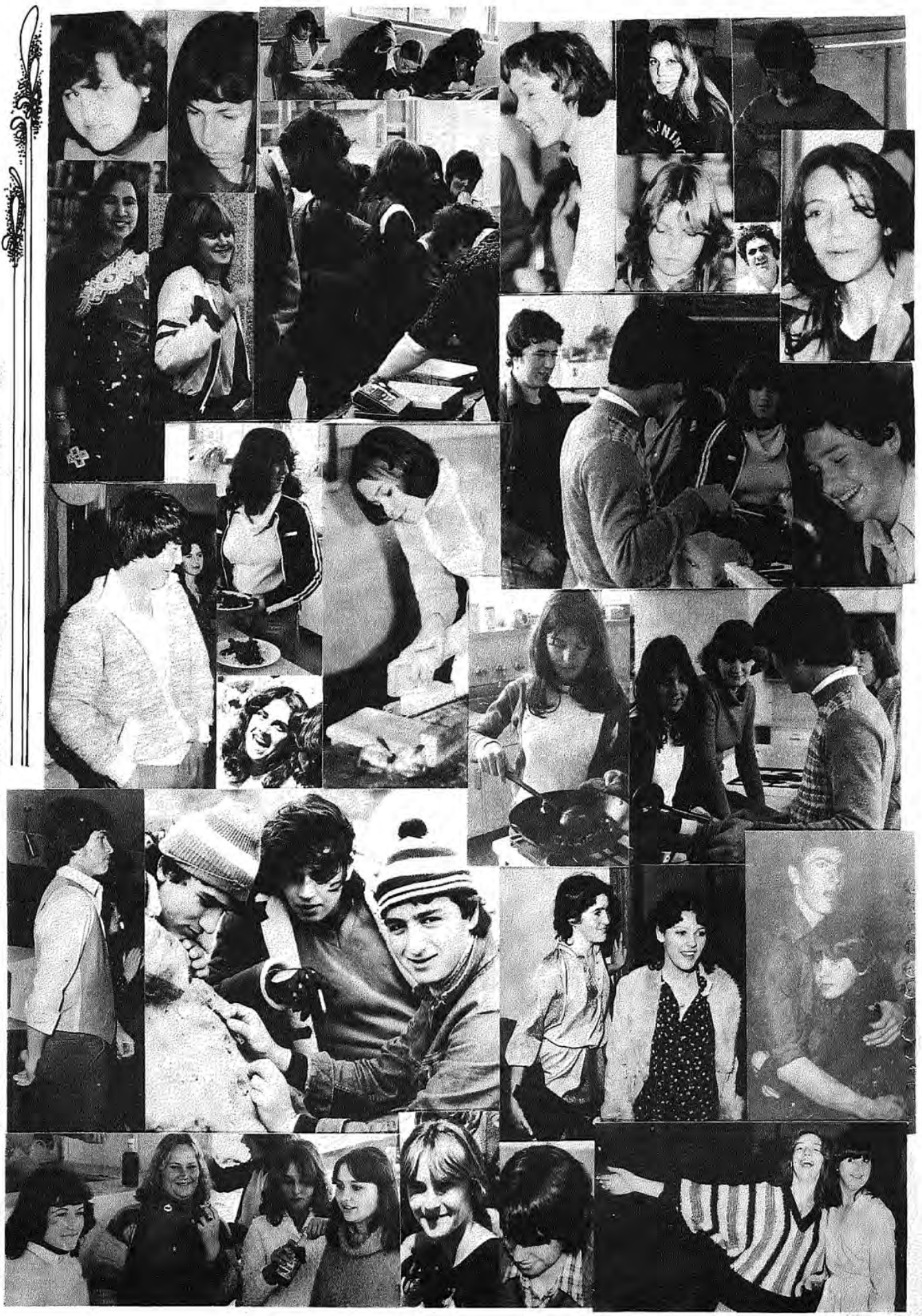
AUTOMOTIVE WORKSHOP

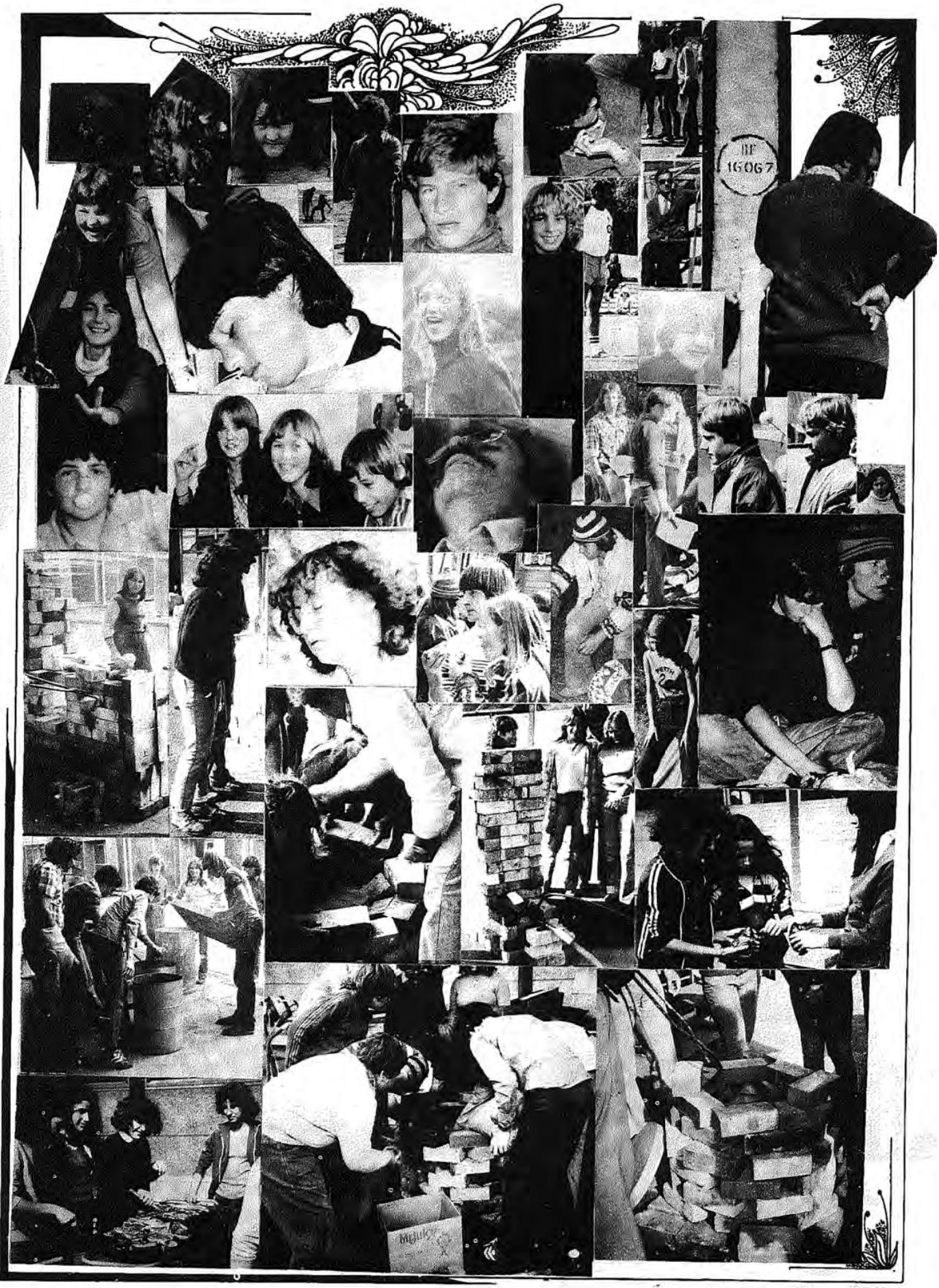

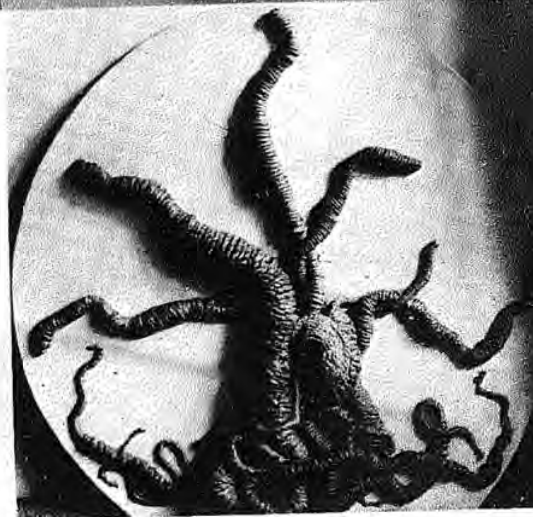
