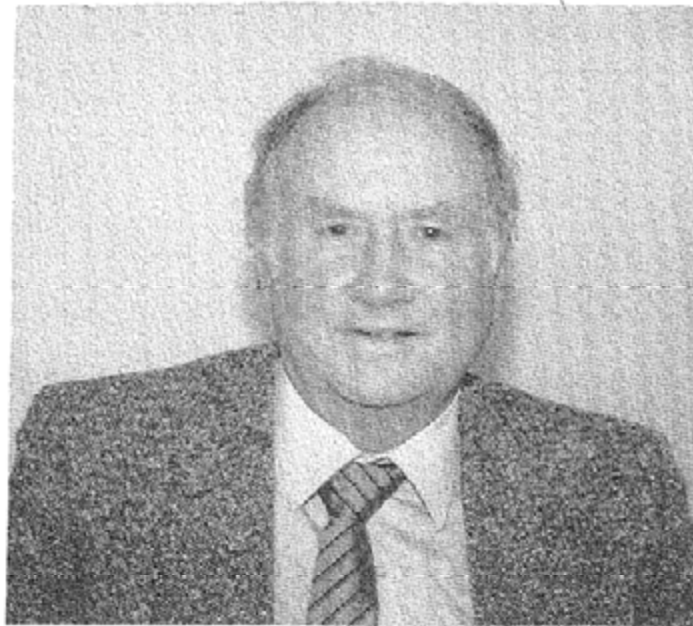

## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

From time to time it is necessary for a school to re-evaluate the purpose of education and the programs it offers to achieve its objectives.

Over the past two decades a multitude of educational theories have flourished. In the effort to find a better way of educating young people we have been too easily seduced by some untried methods and solutions which are akin to fantasies, like 'fake cancer cures' or 'perpetual motion machines'. Some of the new educational methods have taken root and flourished, but many times the educational 'seeds' have never germinated.

This year the school underwent an education audit by a team of educators from outside the school. Among the many strengths of the school program identified by parents and students were the outstanding success of its students in academic studies and sport. Both groups also identified the firm but fair discipline, which underpinned a productive learning climate, as one of the strengths of the school.

It is both rewarding and encouraging to note that the positive features of the school as perceived by the community were

congruent with the goals stated in the school's statement of its mission, or purpose.

I therefore believe as a school community we can take great pride in being on target in meeting our stated objectives.

Keeping this in mind, it is salutary to reflect on the 3 goals which are the cornerstones of our school's vision for its students.

They are straightforward and, in essence, are:

- encouraging academic excellence
- providing for each child's social and personal development through the extra-curricular program
- nurturing a school culture in which children are happy and can learn successfully.

It is interesting to note that despite the educational cycles, fads and fashions of the last two decades, these three fundamental cornerstones, have stood firm, and still form the foundation of a sound education.

## CHESS

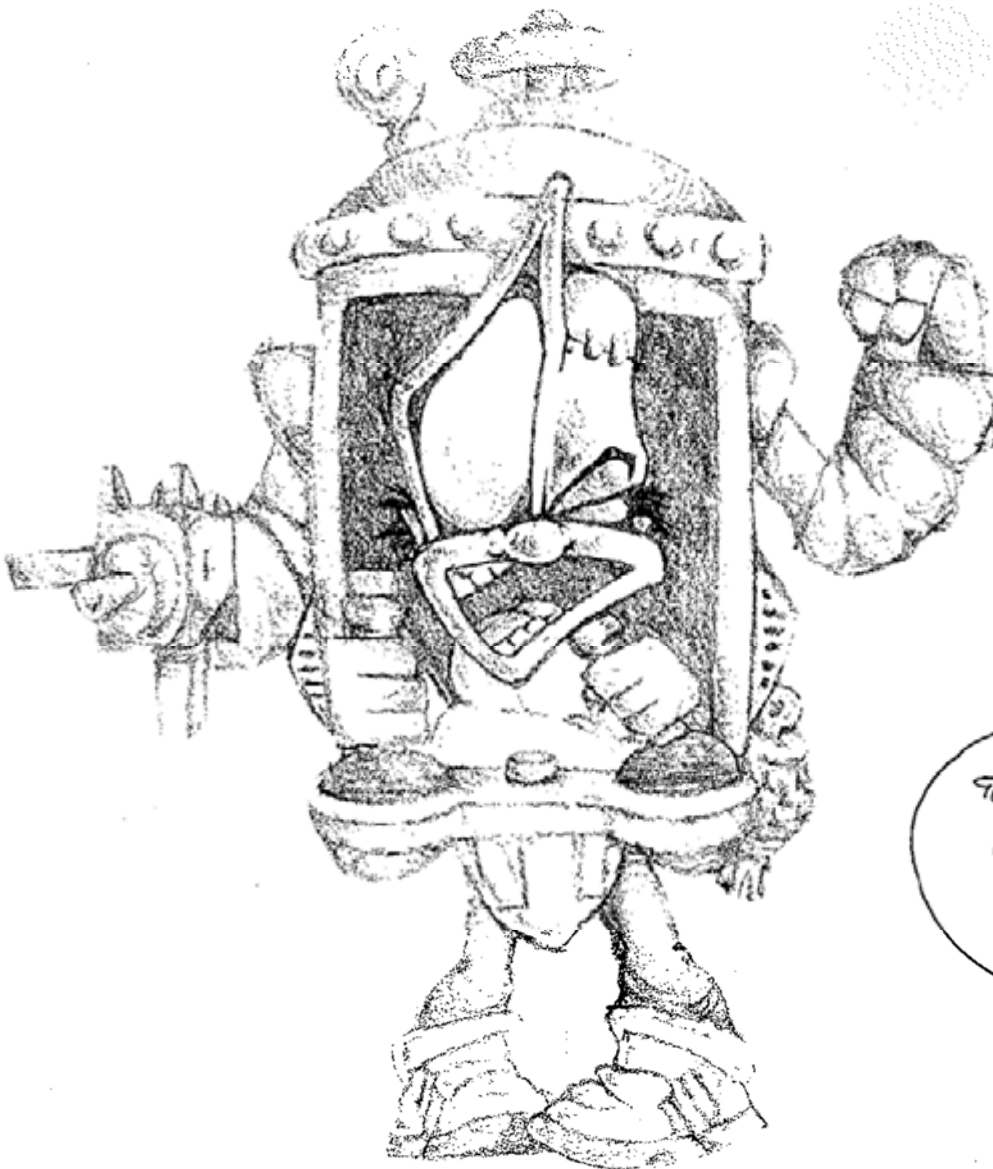
A small band of dedicated players won the interschool junior chess championship this year. At last! Underdale has collected six pennants in ten years, two of these for first place.

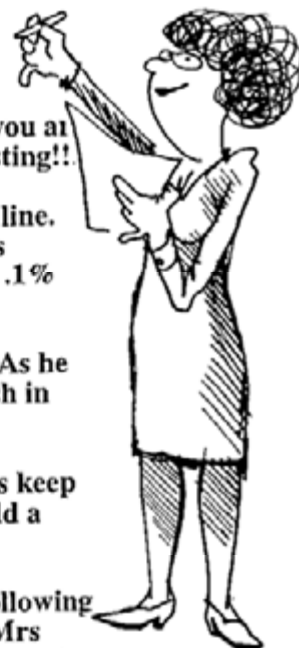

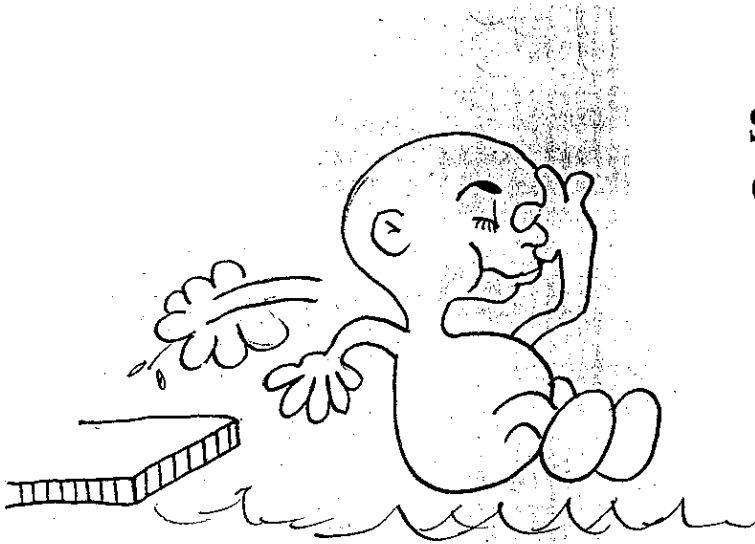

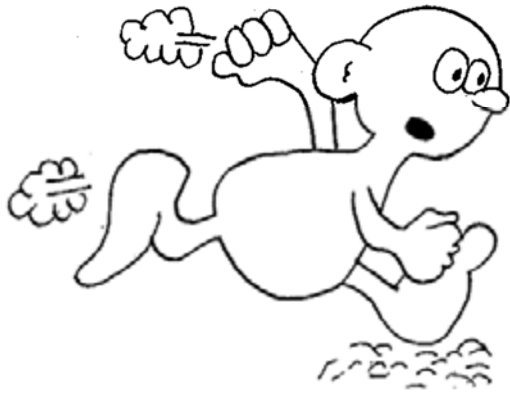
## SWIMMING CARNIVAL

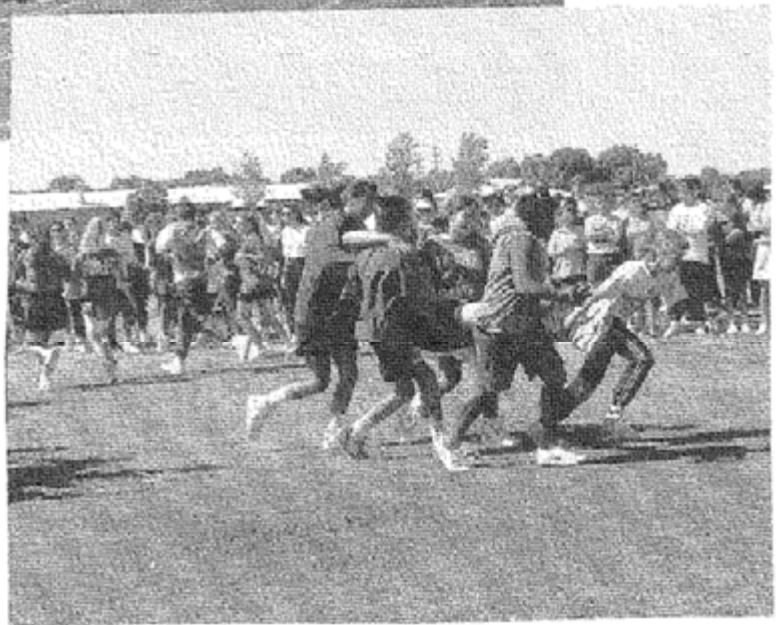
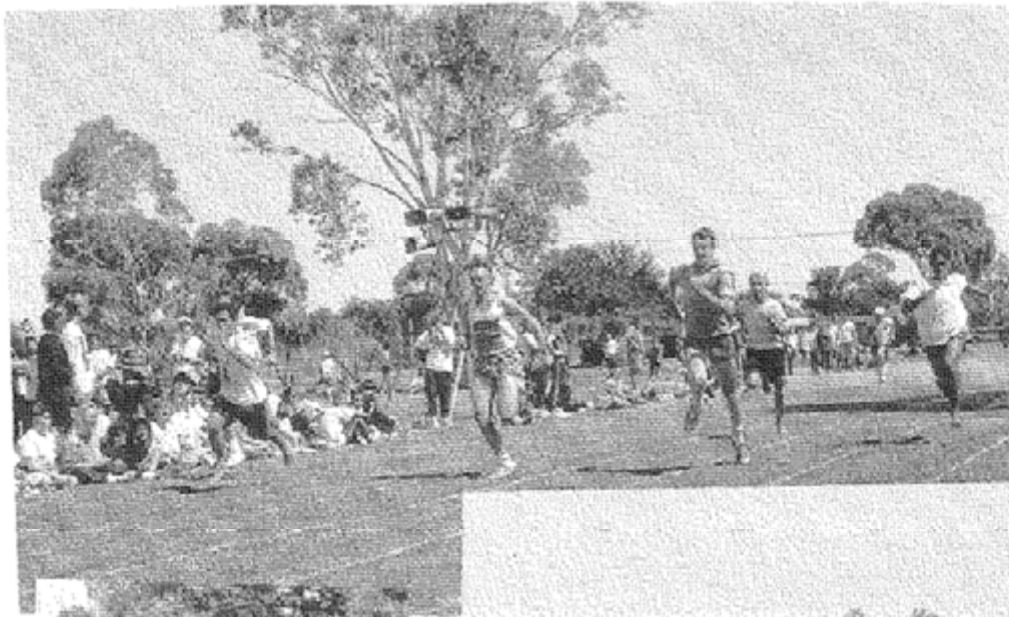
## Sports Day

The sounds of Greece echoed through the school while students performed traditional 'folk dances' and then the more contemporary 'tavern' dances.

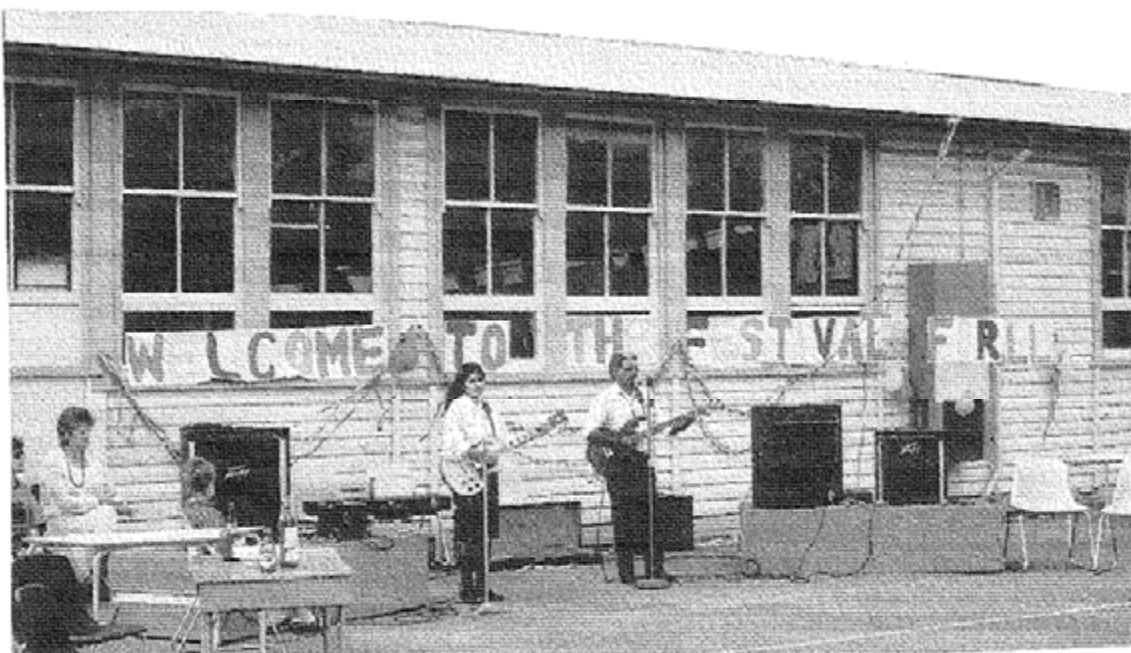
Finally a unique performance of the Wizard of Oz in French delighted all.

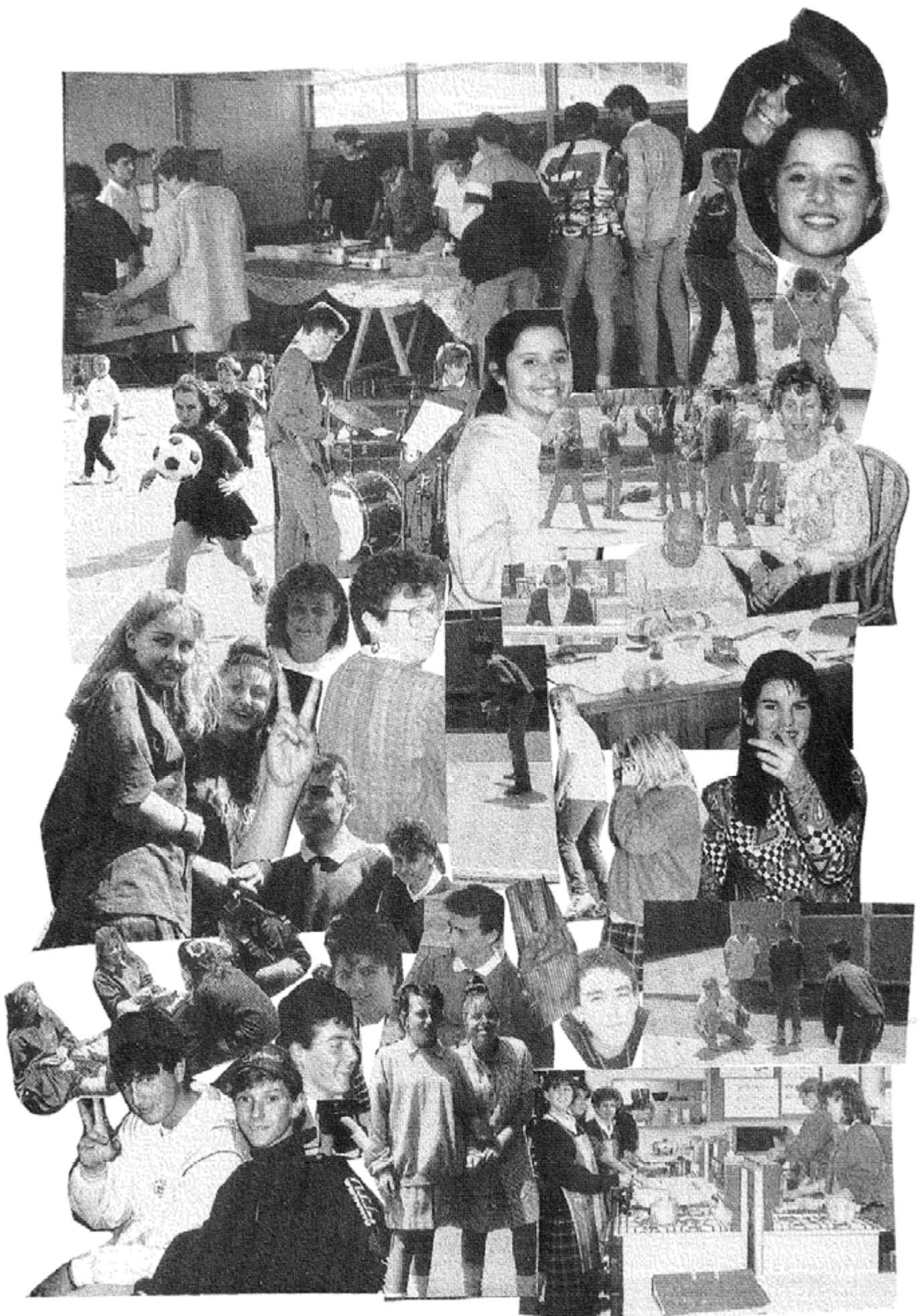
The wake up call which we received each morning from the teachers usually didn't work: we had to get at least two before we got out of bed. One morning the teachers spent twenty minutes banging at our door.

We were able to make friends with most of the other schools. Most people spent the trip back sleeping, except for a couple of trips to Mc Donalds.

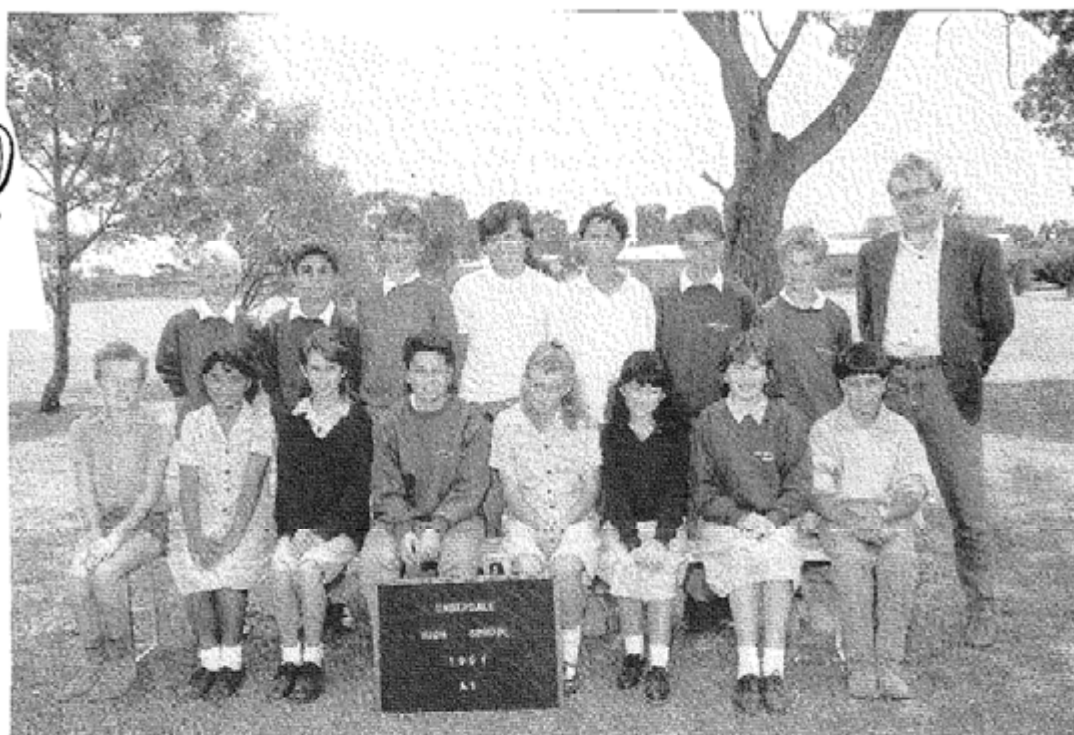

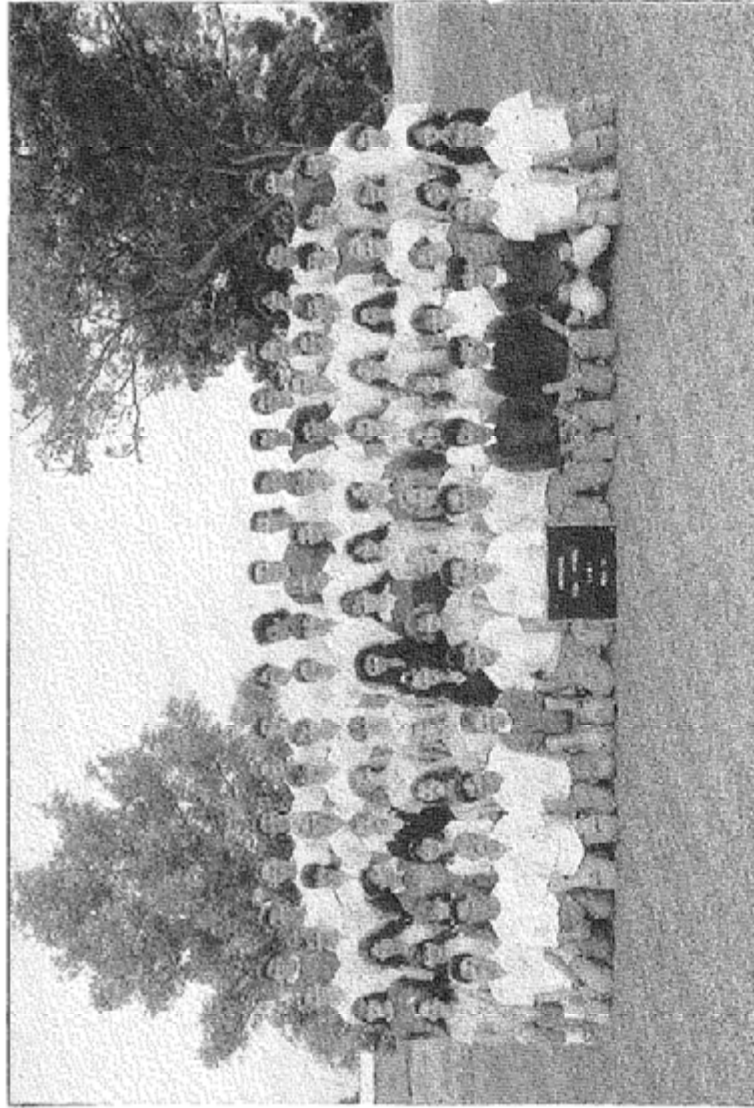

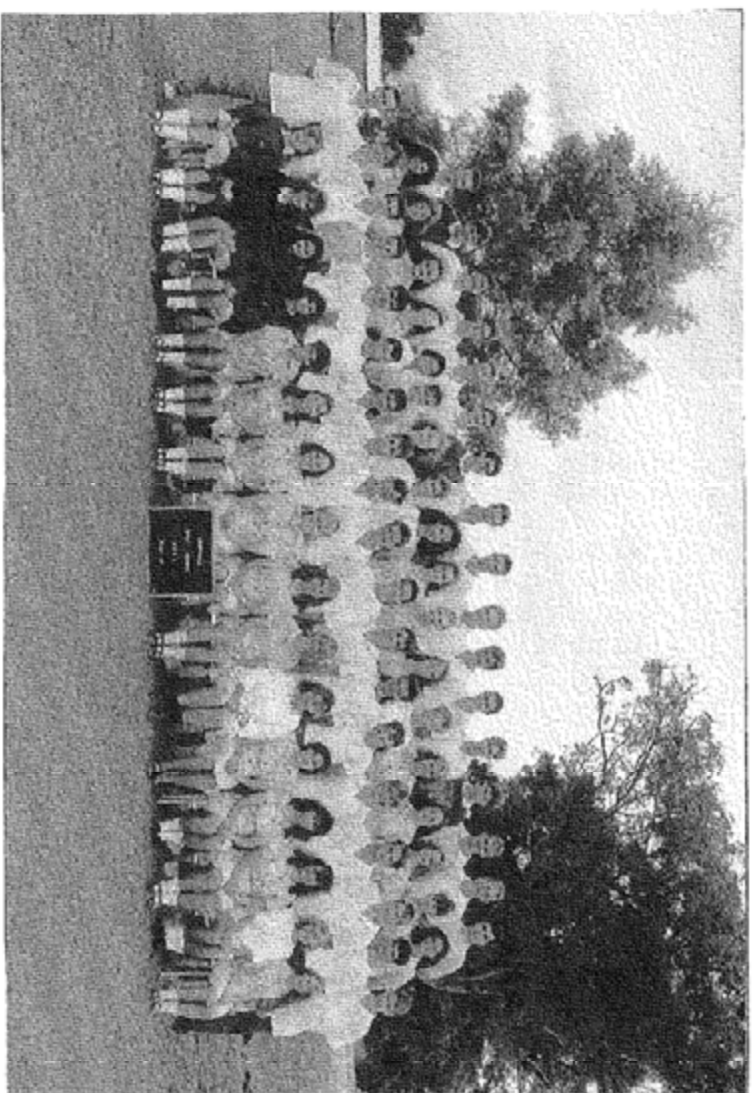

### MY ADVICE TO A YEAR 12 STUDENT FOR 1992

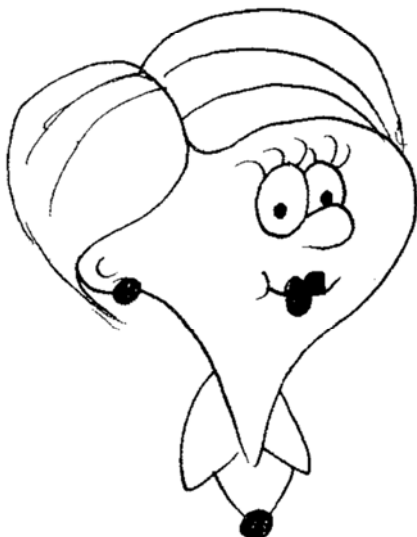

no longer troubled, not wanting to flee.

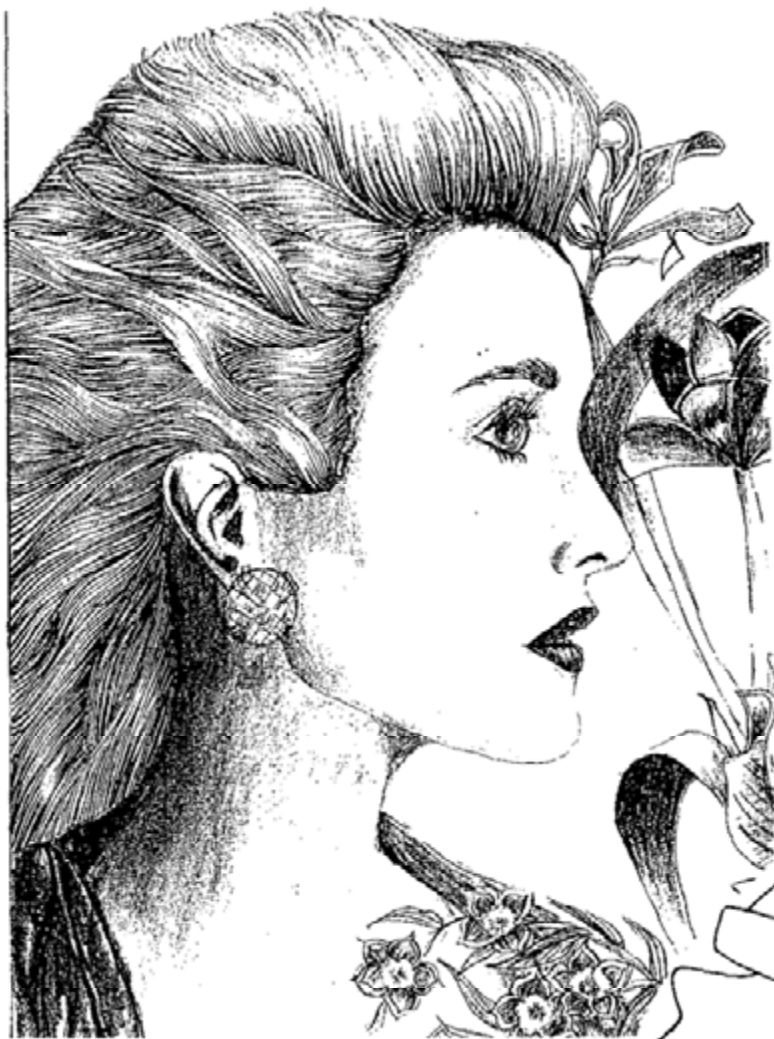

# SACE

## What is the SACE?

SACE is The South Australian Certificate of Education. This certificate is awarded to students who successfully complete their senior secondary education. The certificate replaces the SSABSA Year 12 Certificate of Achievement.

The SACE involves studies at Stage 1 (Year 11 level) and Stage 2 (Year 12 level).

Some subjects – English or English as a Second Language, Mathematics, and Australian Studies – will be compulsory for all students. There will also be an assessment of literacy skills.

The SACE will be a requirement for those students who wish to go on to higher education.

**Stage 1** of the SACE will be introduced in 1992, **Stage 2** in 1993. That is, it will first apply to students who are in Year 10 in 1991. They will enrol for Stage 1 in 1992 and will gain their certificates when they complete Stage 2 in 1993.

Students may take more than two years to gain the SACE. There is no time-limit, only as long as it takes to complete the 22 units and meet other requirements.

## What will students receive upon completing SACE?

On leaving school, students will receive a Transcript of Achievement, recording progress towards satisfying SACE requirements.

This will apply even if all 22 units required for the SACE have not been completed.

When students have completed the SACE requirements, they will receive a:

- I South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE)
- and a
- I Transcript of Achievement
