Hot Dogs were the most prominent product being sold with over four groups selling the product.

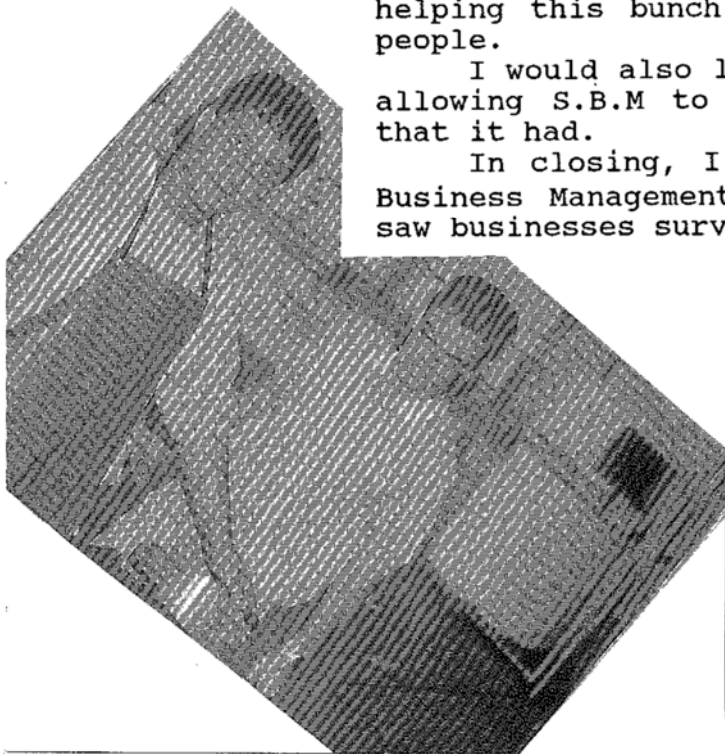
Some groups found the hardships of running a Small Business to be very stressful.

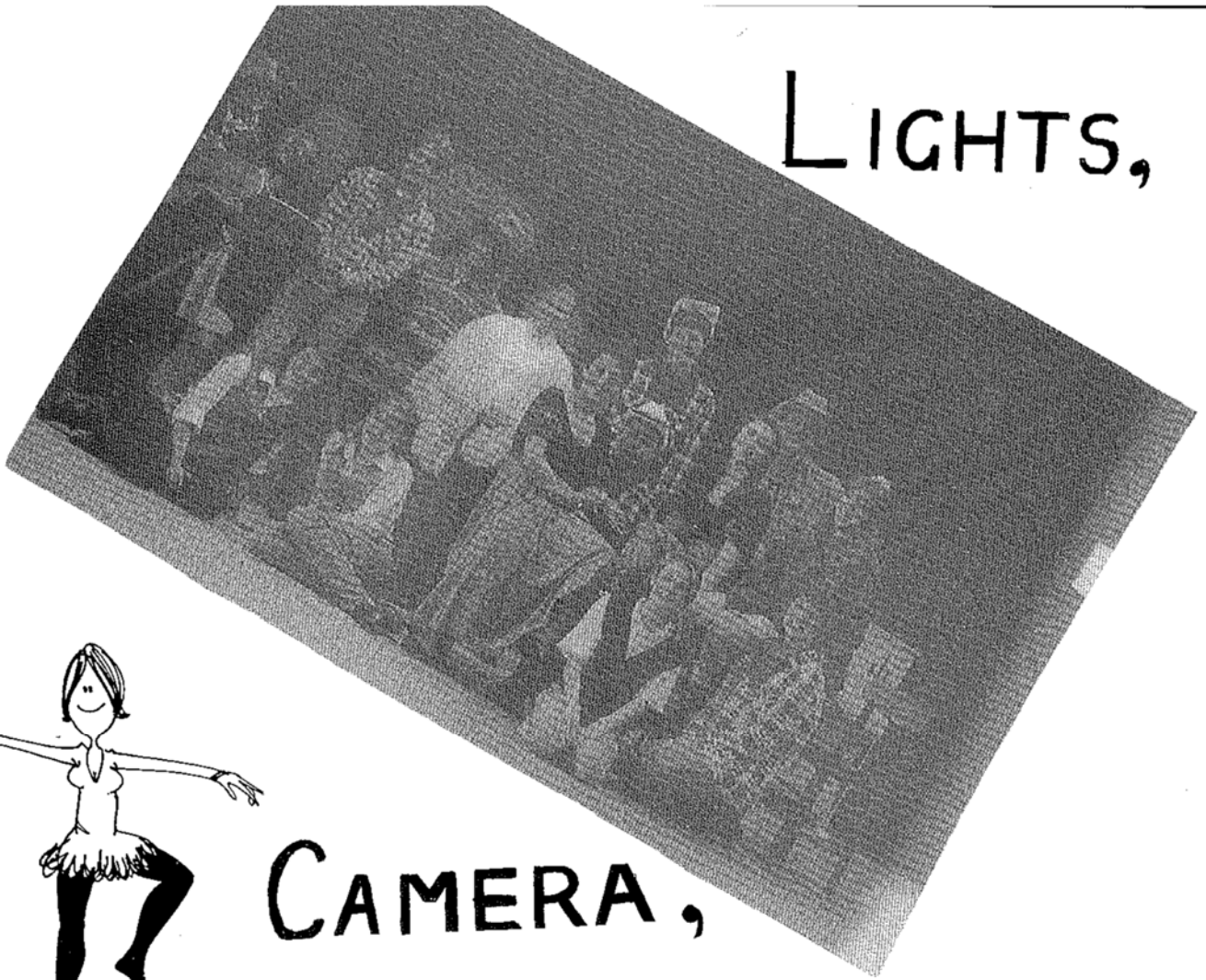

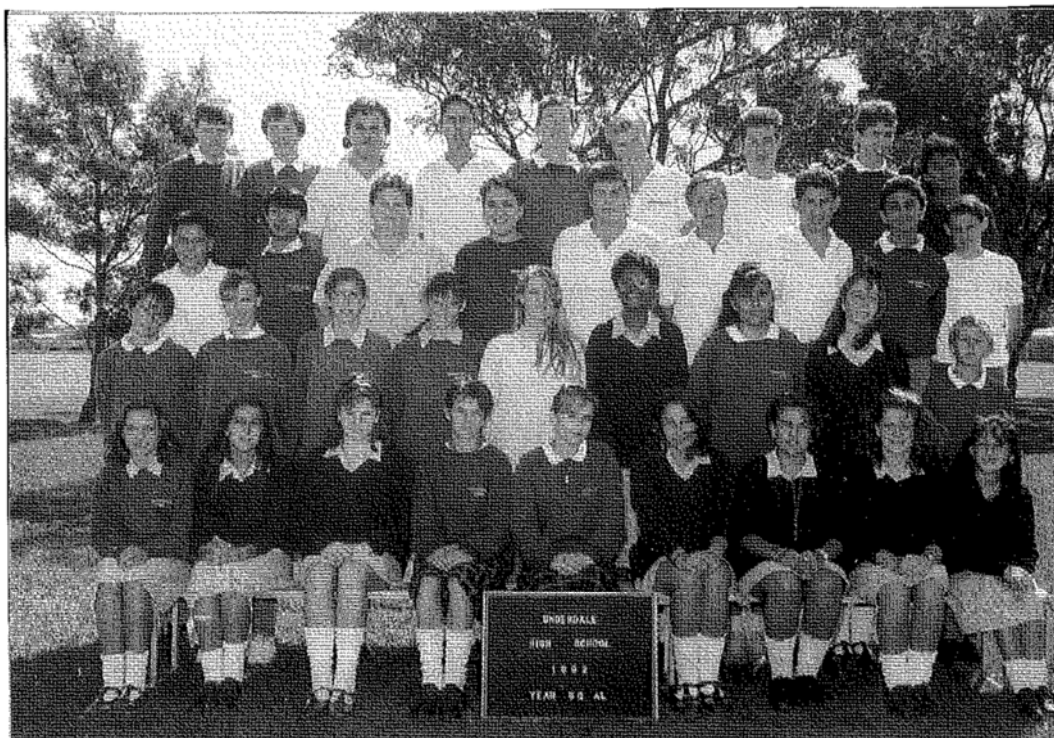
DRAMA 1992

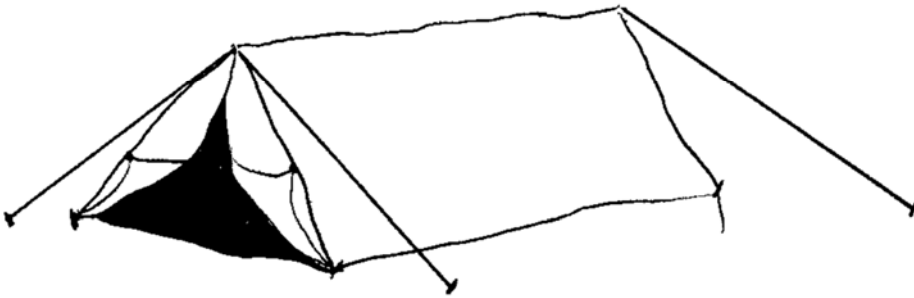


CAMP Coorong

On the 22nd, 23rd and 24th of July, three teachers (Ms Hansen, Mr Dunning, and Ms Allen) set out with seventeen year eleven students in two buses, with a trailer full of luggage, and their three hour journey to Camp Coorong, on the south east coast of South Australia began.

Camp Coorong has been established to enable people of any race or age to learn about the Ngarrindjeri people, their community and culture. Before the camp the class had very little knowledge or understanding of the Coorong or the Aboriginal community which lives there. They learnt from Tom and George Trevorrow (the custodians who live there) about their past and present lifestyle. In those three days everyone began to realise and understand what the Aboriginal people have been through and how unfairly they have been treated by non-Aboriginal settlement.

Anyone who can't relate to Aboriginal people should visit this wonderful place. In fact, there is something for everybody to learn at Camp Coorong. People of SA would better understand Aboriginal people, past and the problems they face today, if they experienced what our year elevens did.

A Tribute to Mr Morley

Mr Morley, Principal of Underdale High School from 1980-1992 has announced his retirement, marking the end of a long and successful career with the SA Education Department.

When Mr Morley came to UHS it was at the crossroads. Demographic predictions forecast that by the mid 1980's Underdale's school population would have declined to less than 500 and closure was possible. Yet throughout the decade Underdale remained a strong and viable high school. That it did so can be largely attributed to the outstanding work done by Mr Morley to build a school with a strong and respectable reputation within the community.

Under Mr Morley's leadership, UHS provided all students with the opportunity to excel in many areas.

Academic excellence was pursued in all subjects, along with a strong commitment to participate in extra-curricular activities both sporting and cultural. Service to the school was also rewarded.

Mr Morley was an excellent communicator stressing to parents, staff and students the need to work together to create a better school community. Students understood that he was concerned for them personally and for the school in general. Mr Morley's door was always open to students and he listened to their cares and concerns, shared in their triumphs, and gave wise advice.

Above all, Mr Morley was a strong leader prepared to consult, and yet to make the decisions necessary in the best interests of the school. He 'led from the front' involving himself in all the tasks which make a successful school. He was indeed a principal highly respected for the obvious fact that his prime concern was for the students, the parents and the staff, in short, the school.

It is hoped that in the near future a gymnasium/hall will be built and will be named the "Don Morley Hall". This will be recognition of his outstanding service to both the school and the Education Department.

We wish him all the very best in his retirement.
