## OPEN GIRLS FOOTBALL REPORT

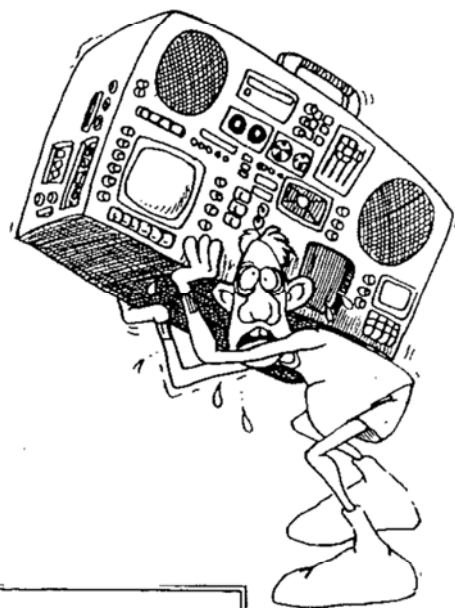

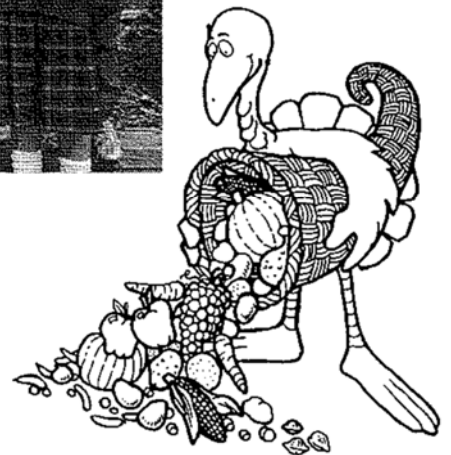
## U14 GIRLS HOCKEY

## NATIONAL AGRIBUSINESS STUDENT EXCHANGE (NASE)

Underdale High School is one of the South Australian schools hosting exchange students who are part of a National Exchange.

The National Agribusiness Student Exchange (NASE) is operated by the Agribusiness Foundation of Australia. The exchange is coordinated by Barbara Durance and is funded and sponsored by Uncle Toby's. The program aims to promote Agriculture in Australia by giving young people the chance to experience and compare urban and rural lifestyles.

The exchanges began in 1988. Students from around Australia participate in the exchange program. In 1993, six exchanges have taken place involving forty one schools and one hundred and twenty four students altogether.

Tennille McLaughlan and Ben Anthony are from Hillston Central School of the Riverina district and are currently exchanging with Underdale High. The exchange operates for six weeks. So far, they have enjoyed being in a new environment with many conveniences. Their school has a population of 230 students from Kindergarten to Year 12. *"Coming to Underdale was a great difference as the population of the school is almost the population of our town!" "Hopefully, whilst on the exchange we will meet and become friends with many people and will take back many fond memories".*
