THE WORK EXPERIENCE PROGRAM AT UNDERDALE HIGH SCHOOL.

Underdale High School offers its senior students the opportunity to be involved in several work experience placements during years 10 and 11.

Work Experience is a well established program at Underdale High, which places students in actual work places so that, by being involved in an adult working environment, they are better prepared for life after leaving school. Paul Manuel (Counsellor) has been available to assist students this year. The work experience office was open on Thursdays for students to meet with me. I also helped them to obtain suitable placements and finalise the necessary paper-work.

At the completion of their Work Experience, students receive written reports which are valuable additions to personal portfolios when applying for jobs. Work Experience information is also included in the Student Achievement Record. Many employers have commented that they feel that the students' work experience reports are of great importance, as they give a true indication of the students' work ethic, and their ability to cope in the workplace. The following comments were written by employers about our students, and would be very impressive when presented at job interviews:

What would you do if you're camping and your friend is bitten by a snake? Panic?

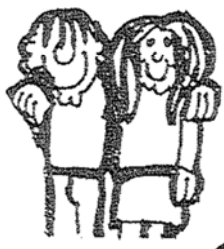

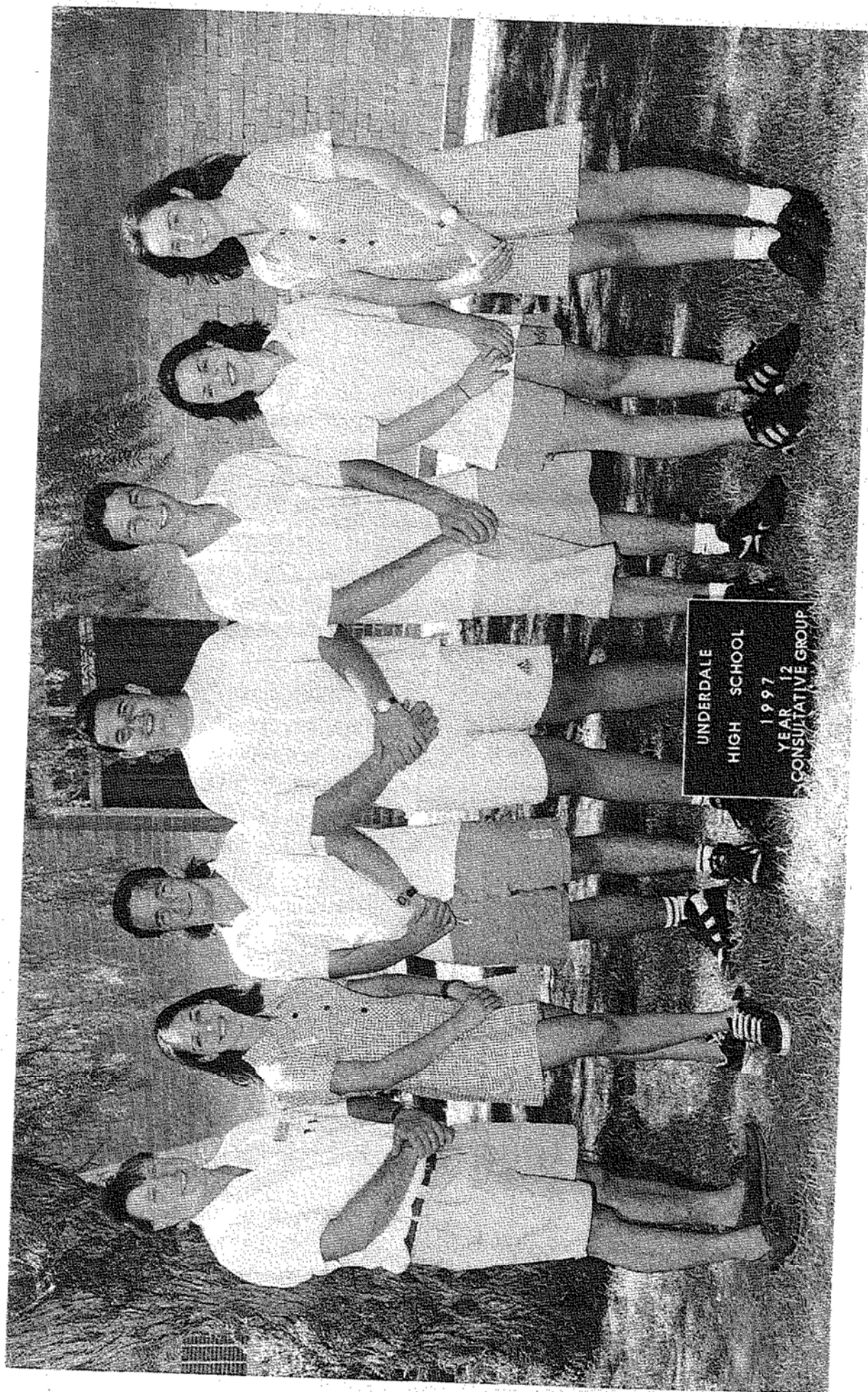
decided to join us this year. At the formal, we give out various awards and prizes. Our advice for next year's group is again "early planning"!

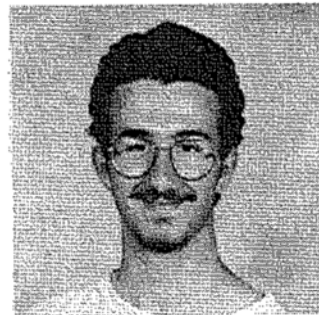
These awards are given to students who have served the school community in a tireless manner and their efforts have enhanced school spirit and reinforced a positive school ethos.
