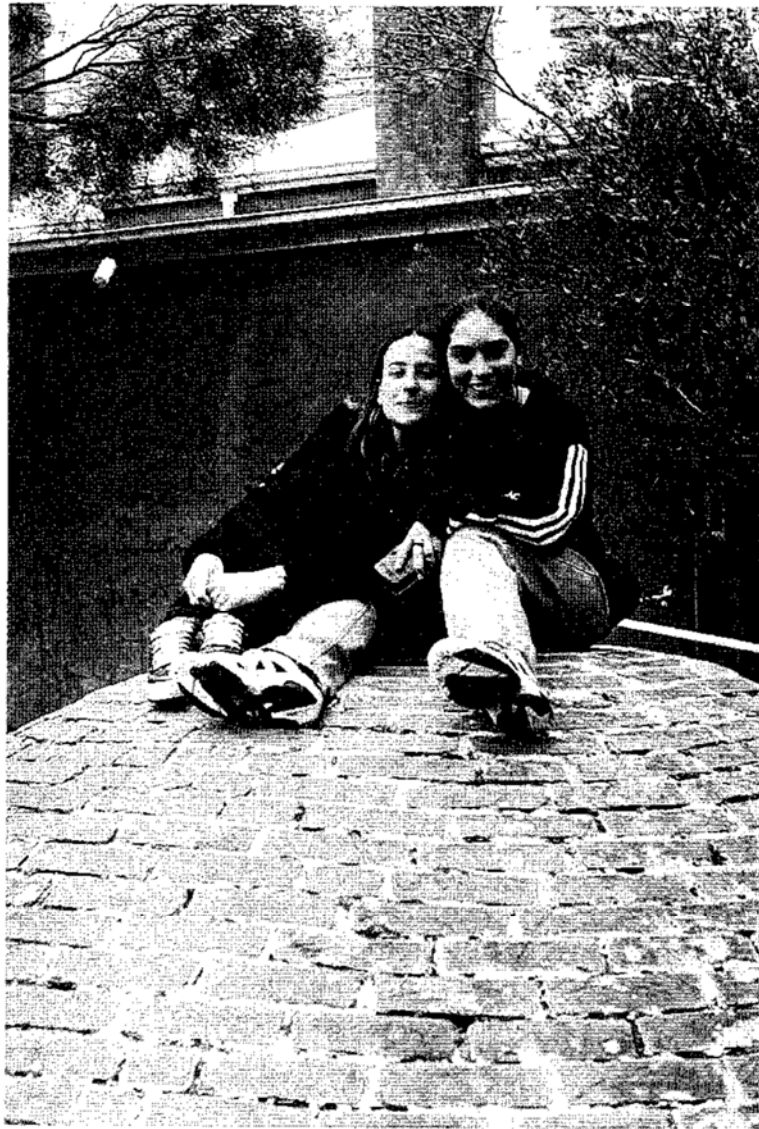
This alone was a huge task because as any experienced camper knows once you have unpacked your things, some how they mysteriously grow larger and don't fit into your bag any more. This may have had
