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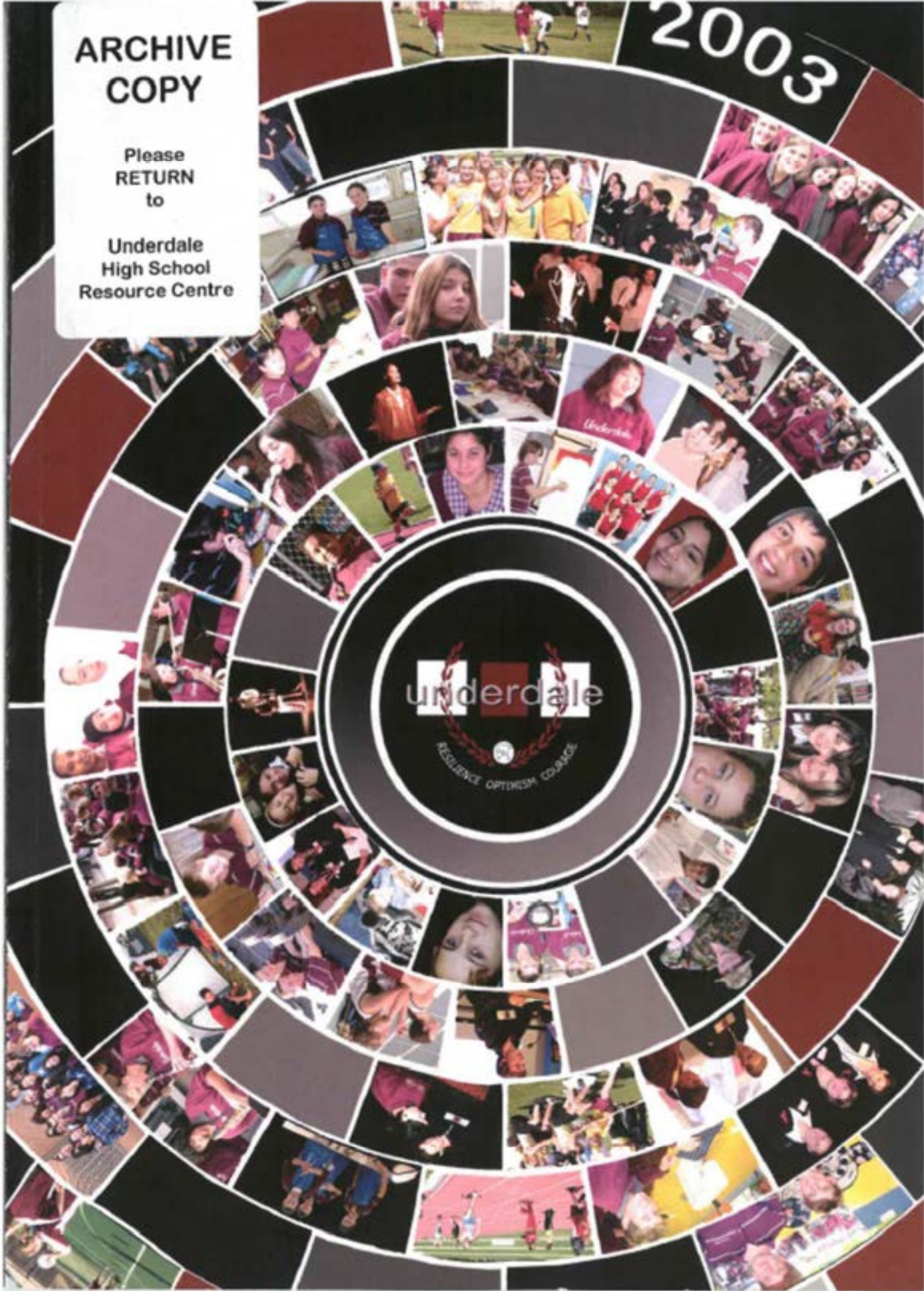

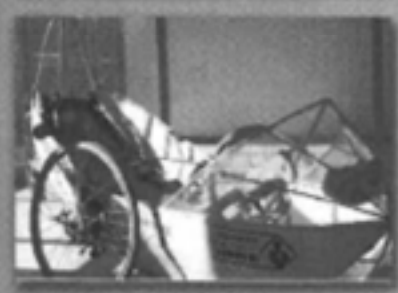

Next year, the aim of the Soccer Academy Program will be to offer Year 8 - 12 students a special, unique opportunity to pursue a comprehensive study of soccer. It will not only aim to impart a high level of expertise in knowledge, skills, fitness and tactical awareness, but also to educate about other related topics within the realm of sport.

One of the main objectives of the Soccer Academy from the onset was to have the program of work fully endorsed by the South Australian Soccer Federation and I'm delighted to report that this objective was achieved with flying colours. This endorsement gives the program credibility and substance so the students may receive a formal, structured and equitable program where a high level of commitment takes place.

The students and their parents sign a contract or an agreement to abide by the rules and conditions set out by the Academy and therefore the education and management of students is at a similar level to that of an elite team. Consequently the students behave and conduct themselves appropriately where a strict code of conduct and dress code apply. They also perform to the best of their academic abilities and strive to achieve academic excellence.

As a result of the unique relationship and rapport established with the South Australian Soccer Federation, one of the main advantages of participating in the Underdale High School Soccer Academy program, is that students with special ability and potential may be identified and recommended for the SASF State Development Squads and the SASI program.

In addition, this year some students will also have the chance to attend the European Football Institute based at the school but conducted privately after school hours, thus forming a professional soccer career path for those students who have dreams of playing professional soccer either in Australia or overseas.
